








GIVING, RECEIVING AND INSPIRING

Coldwater

Cecilia Garcia was a creator. The 10-year-old from Coldwater loved making videos demonstrating how to apply make-up and designing bracelets.

Cecilia was one of 533 heroes who gave organs to patients in need last year.

Her heart, liver and kidneys saved the lives of four people after she drowned in Lake Michigan.

"My daughter loved to help people," her father Omar said.

"She was always taking care of her brothers and keeping me on my toes. I'm so proud to be her dad. I will do anything I can to honor her memory."

The generosity of organ donors in Michigan led to 1,119 organs transplanted in this state and beyond last year.

Jen Bennett's life changed in an instant after an accidental fire left her with severe burns from her head to her toes.

"The pain and trauma were unimaginable, but thanks to tissue donation, I received skin grafts that gave me hope," said Jen, who lives in Ravenna, east of Muskegon. "Today I'm no longer in pain. The donors and their families saved my life."

A record number of Michigan donors — 1,960 — gave tissue in 2024. This marks the third consecutive year Gift of Life has helped a record number of donors give tissue.

More than 1.5 million Americans receive a graft each year, helping them heal wounds, ease pain and improve mobility.

"Why not better the world?"

As Lincoln High School senior Kelly Chambers sees it, organ and tissue donation is the most selfless thing you can do.

"Why not better the world?" he said after Gift of Life visited his Ypsilanti classroom to talk about donation.

His school was one of 512 that Gift of Life visited in 2024 to share its award-winning *All of Us* education program with nearly 39,000 students. The module



gives students a chance to see and hold real human organs and learn the facts about donation — many of which bust rampant myths that hinder some from joining the Michigan Organ Donor Registry.

Nearly **2,500** people attended Gift of Life's six major events across Michigan last year, helping the organization celebrate the gifts of life, sight and mobility.

Attendees traveled to Lansing, Grand Rapids, Detroit, Ann Arbor and Novi for the Champions Gala, Check Your Heart Rally at the Capitol, Donate Life Night at the Zoo, Detroit MOTTEP LIFE Walk/Run, the Check Your Heart Open House at Gift of Life and the annual Michigan Donor Family Gathering.

The events allowed residents to be honored for championing donation, celebrate the gifts of organs and tissue, remember and honor donors and their families, learn about important legislation, contribute financially to the cause, and recognize volunteers, which total more than 200 statewide.

The Donor Registry grew in 2024, with

206,456

people documenting their decisions to save and heal the lives of others.

Much of that growth is attributed to the 2023 Check Your Heart Act, which allows residents to join the Donor Registry when they file their



state income taxes. Michigan was the first in the nation to allow residents to sign up as organ, eye and tissue donors this way.

Lansing's Ron Leix was one of 14,455 Michigan residents who checked the box on his tax form.

"It was really easy to do," he said. "I know someone who recently had a kidney transplant, and it made me think, if something happened to me, I would

want someone else to benefit like that. That's what really made me say, 'This is just something I've got to do'."

More than 2,500 Michigan patients are waiting for a lifesaving transplant. More than 100,000 are waiting nationwide. The best way to save lives is by joining the Donor Registry.
